

How to Use Your Carts

- **All materials must fit within the carts completely with lids closed.**
- Place carts **out by 7:00 a.m.** on your collection day. *Please do not place your carts out before your collection day to reduce conflicts with wildlife.
- **Extra garbage?** Up to two (2) additional garbage bags that display a 'tag a bag' sticker and are not inside a garbage can will be collected.
- **Place your carts** on the street with arrow pointing towards the road and the wheels against the curb. Leave 1m (3ft) of space between each cart and any obstacles for truck access. (No curb? Place carts on the shoulder.)



Please do not block bicycle lanes or sidewalks. Carts must not be an obstacle for cyclists or pedestrians.

<p>YARD AND GARDEN WASTE: Green Lid BI-WEEKLY curbside collection of yard and garden waste, March 1st to November 30th.</p> <p>Residents are encouraged to explore alternative methods to reduce green waste like grasscycling and composting.</p>	<p>Put all yard waste loosely into cart. NO plastic bags or containers.</p> <p>Do not pack materials into the cart; it will not empty when dumped.</p> <p>Yard or garden waste is not permitted in the garbage cart.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grass clippings • Leaves • Weeds • Plant trimmings • Prunings and branches up to 5cm (2in) in diameter AND less than 1m (3ft) long • Pine needles & cones • Pumpkins <p>Yard waste must fit in cart with lid closed</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No plastic bags • No dirt, sod, rocks or tree stumps • No kitchen or food waste, or fruit droppings • No diapers • No used tissue or paper towels • No regular garbage • No animal feces or kitty litter • No construction or renovation materials • No agricultural or commercial waste • No landscape fabric • No flower pots <p><i>NO yard waste collection December, January or February.</i></p>

What to Recycle

Place all your clean recyclables out for collection on your scheduled day. No bags, and no pre-sorting needed. (All materials must fit in cart with lid closed.) The materials listed here are accepted for recycling. These items are **NOT** accepted as garbage.



Tin Cans

- All tin cans.
- Empty and rinse.
- Labels are ok.
- **NEW:** Keep lids attached.



Aluminum

- Foil and food containers.
- Empty and rinse.
- Labels are ok.

Newspapers

- All newspapers and flyers, including all inserts and all ad mail.



Books, Magazines, Phone Books

- All magazines and catalogues, books without hard covers.



Paper

- All white, neon and coloured paper and envelopes.
- All computer paper, labels and envelopes with windows.
- **NO** carbon paper, used tissue or paper towels.



Plastics

- All household plastic containers with the #1-7 recycling symbols - rinse



- All stretchy plastic film, including grocery bags.
- **NO** styrofoam, **NO** motor oil or chemical containers.
- **NO** lids under 6 inches.



Corrugated Cardboard

- Clean cardboard boxes, pizza boxes, etc.
- **NO** waxed or plastic coated cardboard.



Boxboard & Heavy Paper

- Cereal box-type cardboard, brown envelopes, paper bags, cardboard egg cartons, colored paper, gift wrap, etc.
- Flatten boxes and remove liners.
- **NO** waxed, plastic coated cartons or foil gift wrap.

\$2.50 per bag household garbage.
Minimum of \$8 for 250 kgs or less.
Over 250 kgs is pro-rated at \$65/tonne.

\$40 per metric tonne

Q:// WHAT ARE THE ACCEPTABLE ELECTRONIC ITEMS INCLUDED IN THE PROGRAM?

A:// The following items can be recycled free of charge at any Encorp Return-It Electronics™ Collection Site: display devices, desktop computers, portable computers, computer peripherals, computer scanners, printers and fax machines, non-cellular phones and answering machines, vehicle audio and video systems (aftermarket), home audio and video systems, and personal or portable audio and video systems.

Q:// WHAT IS THE ELECTRONICS STEWARDSHIP ASSOCIATION OF BRITISH COLUMBIA (ESABC) PROGRAM?

A:// ESABC is a not-for-profit extended producer responsibility program set up by the major producers and retailers of electronics in British Columbia to provide a province wide recycling system for unwanted electronics available to all consumers and businesses in BC. The ESABC program is designed to shift the responsibility for the environmentally safe and socially responsible recycling of unwanted products from BC taxpayers (through municipalities and regional districts) to the producers and consumers of these products.

Unplugged accepts over 120 small electrical appliances, ranging in size from electric toothbrushes to countertop microwave ovens.
